Making a donation to your local food bank is easy!

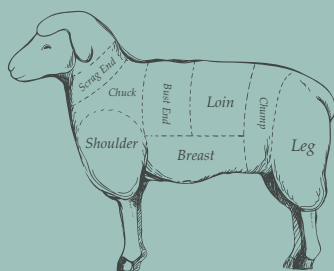


Why Donate?



25% TAX CREDIT

Ontario was the first province in Canada to offer farmers a 25% non-refundable tax credit for donating fresh food to food banks



MEAT IS #1

How to Donate



1. FIND

Have product you would like to donate? Locate your closest OAFB member food bank by visiting oafb.ca/search



2. CONNECT

Connect with your food bank to determine their hours of operation and their logistical capabilities for pick-up or delivery



3. DETAILS

Provide the food bank with a detailed breakdown of the donated product (including price per pound). This will be used to generate your tax receipt.



4. RECEIPT

Your local food bank will issue you a gift-in-kind tax receipt for the product you donated. This receipt will be used to claim 25% of the total value in your income taxes.
