Call for nominations for Long Service and Outstanding Shepherd Awards

OSMA is seeking nominations for two awards that will be presented at the upcoming Annual General Meeting in October.

Long Service Award

This award recognizes significant contributions to the advancement of the Ontario Sheep Industry over many years of service. It is given in acknowledgement and appreciation of long standing contribution to the Ontario Sheep Industry. Recipients of this award have demonstrated outstanding dedication, leadership and innovative spirit.

Outstanding Shepherd Award

This award recognizes significant contributions to the advancement of the Ontario Sheep Industry. It is presented to an Ontario Shepherd who exemplifies the values of leadership and responsible sheep husbandry.

Guidelines for Long Service and Outstanding Shepherd Awards:

- 1. Nominations must be received at the Ontario Sheep Marketing Agency office no later than October 3, 2016.
- 2. Only members of the Ontario Sheep Marketing Agency will be considered as candidates.
- 3. Individuals or couples are eligible for nomination.
- 4. Candidates must have made a significant contribution to the Ontario Sheep Industry. Candidates will be selected for the award based on demonstrated achievements within the Ontario Sheep Industry.
- 5. The awards will be presented at the OSMA Annual General Meeting in October.
- 6. Please include 2-5 letters of support from associations or individuals with your nomination.
- 7. Submissions that do not follow these guidelines may be returned to the nominator or not considered for the award.

If you know someone who deserves to be recognized through one of these awards, please nominate them by October 3, 2016. - 2. Entries must be submitted in the name of the person who took the photograph.
- **3.** Only two (2) entries per photographer, per category will be accepted.
- 4. The judges' decision is final.



The report includes information about feed quality as a result of the dry weather in southern Ontario, the potential for nitrate poisoning in dry weather and, toxic plants.



Share your experiences and ideas for the next agricultural policy framework

Federal, provincial and territorial (FPT) governments are working together to develop the next agricultural policy framework. They want your feedback to help shape the direction of future policy and programs for the agriculture and agri-food sector. Tell them what you would like to see in the next framework.

Through a second questionnaire the government is asking for your feedback on the *Calgary Statement*. The *Calgary Statement* was released by Federal, Provincial and Territorial Ministers of Agriculture on July 22, 2016. It outlines the key priority areas that will guide the development of the next agricultural policy framework.

The feedback will be summarized and posted as a report on Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada website in 2017.

Canada's Farmers Grow Communities

Now in its fourth full year, Canada's Farmers Grow Communities is a program aimed at strengthening rural communities by equipping local non-profit organizations with funds to carry out much-needed community work. The aim is for farmers to help improve the lives of people living in rural communities. The Monsanto Fund, the philanthropic arm of the Monsanto Company, has expanded the Canada's Farmers program to provide a total of 66 grants, each valued at \$2,500, to charitable and not-for-profit groups nominated by farmers. In the past three years, Canadian farmers have applied on behalf of agricultural societies, 4-H clubs, playgrounds, daycares and school projects, community sporting organizations, libraries and health/service groups.

Farmers Tell us about your favourite charitable or not-for-profit group in your community and how they would benefit from a \$2,500 grant and you could win. A total of 66 grants (two per territory) will be randomly awarded in 33 territories across Canada.

Not a farmer? You can still help. Do you know a local charity or not-for-profit group that needs support? Maybe you volunteer with a group in your rural community? You can pass along the name of a program or organization that would benefit from a \$2,500 grant.
