Ontario Master Shepherd's Course Update

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ave you ever asked yourself, "How can I make my farm profitable?" or "How can I manage my Ilock to be more productive?" or "Where can I find the answers to my lamb production questions?" If you've answered yes to any of these, then enrollment in the Ontario Master Shepherd's Course could be for you. Twelve education modules of two days each will be starting the first week in August 2014. We are currently developing the course curriculum to cover such topics as business planning, goal setting, selecting flock replacements through genetic selection, record keeping and understanding reports, nutrition, feeding systems including pasture management, infrastructure, flock health management, lambing and lamb rearing, predation, marketing, future planning and much more. Over a period of 14 months, you will hear presentations from leading experts, seasoned farmers and Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food (OMAF) specialists. We already have commitments from numerous OMAF specialists. A full list of guest speakers will be posted on the OSMA website as they become available. Also included is the opportunity to participate in practical demonstrations and farm tours.

The first module regarding business planning is scheduled to begin the first week of August 2014. Modules will be opened to extra participants who may wish to enroll in only selections from the course. The registration cost for individual modules is \$250 per person for two days of instruction. A late registration fee of \$350 applies to individual modules and the deadline will be 2 weeks prior to the start date of each module.

The application deadline has been extended to July 7th. For those students who have already enrolled in the complete 12 education modules, remember that a deposit of \$1,000 is required by July 7, 2014 to secure your enrollment, with the balance of \$1,400 due on December 1, 2014.

We have had many inquiries as to the location of these education modules. The first four modules will be held in Guelph and we are investigating other locations for subsequent modules. Ideally, the course locations will rotate around the province, and consideration will be given to the geographic location of the selected course participants.
