2016 Census of Agriculture

At the beginning of May 2016, farm operators will be asked to update Canada's agricultural profile by completing the 2016 Census of Agriculture questionnaire.

The census will provide farmers, farm organizations, policy makers, stakeholders, and citizens with relevant information about the future of the Canadian agricultural sector and help them make informed decisions regarding agricultural practices in this country.

Stakeholders

The participation of sheep farmers in the Census of Agriculture is an important factor in obtaining new information at the local and national levels.

Accurate statistics give agriculture practitioners an understanding of where we've come from and where we are now, and allow for a well-informed response to tomorrow's farming challenges.

Policy makers

The Census of Agriculture is the backbone of Canada's agricultural statistics program. It identifies trends, opportunities and challenges within the agricultural sector. Questions cover topics such as land use, crops, livestock, agricultural labour, machinery and equipment, land management practices, and farm finances. The breadth and depth of the census content renders it the most definitive source of information on the agricultural sector, providing a rich source of data about the realities of farming life in Canada.

Farmers

In early May, you will receive a letter with easy-to-follow instructions on how to complete your Census of Agriculture questionnaire online. This user-friendly option will save you time by automatically adding totals and limiting the questions to the ones that apply to your operation.

The questionnaire can be completed by anyone who is responsible for, or knowledgeable about, the day-to-day management decisions of your farming operation. As required by the *Statistics Act*, the information you provide will be kept confidential and used only for statistical purposes.

This May, add your voice to those of Canada's sheep farmers by completing your Census of Agriculture questionnaire!

QUICK SHEEP FARMING FACTS FROM THE 2011 CENSUS OF AGRICULTURE:

- There were 1.1 million sheep and lambs on Canadian farms. Ontario led the country with 352,807 (31.8%), followed by Quebec with 272,574 (24.6%) and Alberta with 202,903 (18.3%).
- Only 10,111 Canadian operators reported raising sheep and lambs.
- The average herd size of a farm was 111 sheep and lambs. The largest farms were in Quebec (234 sheep and lambs) and the smallest in British Columbia (36 sheep and lambs).
- There were 2,903 farms that **specialized in sheep and lamb farming** (the majority of their farm receipts was received from sheep and lamb farming). Here are some facts about these farms:
 - There was a total of 626,577 sheep and lambs (57.5% of the total number in Canada).
 - The largest 5% of all specialized sheep and lamb farms raised 18% of all Canadian sheep and lambs.
 - Among the specialized sheep and lamb farms, 58.9% were held in sole proprietorship; 33.3% were owned in partnerships; 6.3% were owned by family corporations; and 1.3% were owned by non-family corporations.
 - $\circ~$ The average herd size of a specialized farm was 216 sheep and lambs.
 - There were 4,375 operators across Canada and 61.7% were male.
 - $\circ~$ The average age of an operator was 52 years old.
 - Among the operators, 48.3% were 55 years and older; 43.5% were 35 to 54 years old and 8.2% were under the age of 35.
 - Furthermore, 39.2% of operators did not work anywhere other than on the farm, while 24.3% worked more than 40 hours per week at another job in addition to their farming duties.

Ontario Forage and Hay Coop Receives GF2 Funding

The Ontario Hay and Forage Co-operative, working in collaboration with the Ontario Forage Council, announced today that it has received *Growing Forward* 2 funding approval from the Agricultural Adaptation Council for a comprehensive Feasibility Study and Business Plan for its double-compaction hay processing facility. The *Growing Forward* 2 funding of \$81,116 will enable the Co-operative to build a strong business case for its plan to build a facility capable of processing up to 100,000 tonnes of premium quality Ontario hay annually.

operative's project. "By leveraging members' investment, the Agricultural Adaptation Council's grant enables us to prepare the thorough Feasibility Study and comprehensive Business Plan essential to launch a project of this magnitude," said Trauttmansdorff. Ontario Forage Council Manager Ray Robertson congratulated the start-up Co-operative, adding that "this once again demonstrates the critical role that *Growing Forward 2* can play in supporting new ventures aiming to build new markets for Ontario agricultural products."

The recently formed Co-operative is aiming to tap into export markets for superior forages to support growing dairy, equine, and livestock markets, particularly in Asia and the Middle East. The Co-operative's goal is to increase returns for producers by enabling them to obtain higher prices for their hay. By working with producers to establish on-farm hay-drying facilities, and building a facility to compact their hay into compressed square bales for overseas shipment, the Co-operative intends to offer a premium product to buyers in the livestock and equine sectors.

The Ontario Hay and Forage Co-operative has been structured as a "new generation co-operative" which means that producers will be both entitled and obligated to deliver hay to the Co-operative. Members will invest in the Co-operative in proportion to the volume of hay they commit to deliver to the Co-operative. Profits from the venture will be shared among members based on the volume of hay they ship to the Co-operative. An incentive structure will be developed to reward member producers for premium quality hay. This project was funded in part through *Growing Forward 2 (GF2)*, a federal-provincial-territorial initiative. The Agricultural Adaptation Council assists in the delivery of *GF2* in Ontario.
